DO NOT use or perform maintenance on this machine until this manual has been read and understood. In addition, read the Operation and Maintenance Manual(s) pertaining to the attachment and the attachment carrier ("Loader").

The user is responsible for inspecting the machine daily, and for having parts repaired or replaced when continued use of the machine would cause damage, excessive wear to other parts or make the machine unsafe for continued operation.

If an operating procedure, tool device, maintenance or work method not specifically recommended is used, you must satisfy yourself that it is safe for you and others. You must also ensure that the attachment will not be damaged or made unsafe by the procedures you choose.

Erskine Attachments LLC cannot anticipate every possible circumstance that might involve potential hazard. The safety messages found in this manual and on the machine are therefore not all inclusive.

The signal words **CAUTION**, **WARNING**, or **DANGER** are used to indicate hazards.

▲ CAUTION Indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury.

▲ WARNING Indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

▲ DANGER Indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

The word **IMPORTANT**, is used in the text when immediate damage will occur due to improper technique or operation.

The word **NOTE** is used to convey information that is out of context with the manual text; special information such as specifications, techniques, reference information, and other information of a supplementary nature.

Improper operation can cause serious injury or death.

Pre-operation

- This attachment is designed for light tilling and windrowing in dirt only. It is not designed to be used as a deep soil tiller. NEVER use this machine for any other purpose.
- Read the operator's manual for the "Skid Steer Loader." NEVER allow untrained people to operate.
- Operating instructions must be given to everyone before operating this attachment and at least once a year thereafter in accordance with OSHA regulations.
- NEVER exceed the maximum recommended input power or speed specifications for the attachment. Over-powering or over-speeding the attachment may cause personal injury and/or machine damage.
- Keep all shields, guards, and covers in place.
- Do not modify equipment or add attachments that are not approved by Erskine Attachments LLC.
- Use adequate safety warning lights and devices as required by local regulations. Obey all local laws and regulations regarding machine operation on public property. Always call before you dig (1-888-258-0808). When you call, you will be directed to a location in your state/city for information about buried lines (electric, telephone, cable TV, water, sewer, gas, etc.).

Operation

- Always wear eye protection that meets z87.1 or use with a loader enclosure that provides similar protection.
- Hydraulic connections may be hot after use. Use gloves if connecting or disconnecting after use.
- Check and be sure all operating controls are in neutral before starting the engine.

Operation (continued)

- Keep people away from loader, attachment and discharge when in use. This attachment sends objects flying and has rotating parts. NEVER direct discharge toward people – rocks and debris can be thrown.
- NEVER operate near embankments or terrain that is so steep that rollover could occur.
- Always stay in the operator position when using the attachment.
- Before leaving the operators position, disengage hydraulic drive, lower the attachment to rest flat on the ground, stop engine, set park brake, and wait for all motion to stop.
- **NEVER** place hands near attachment or clear debris while the engine is running.

Avoid High Pressure Fluids Hazard



- Escaping fluid under pressure can penetrate the skin causing serious injury.
- Avoid the hazard by relieving the pressure before disconnecting hydraulic lines.
- Use a piece of paper or cardboard, NOT BODY PARTS, to check for suspected leaks. Wear protective gloves and safety glasses or goggles when servicing or performing maintenance on hydraulic systems.
- If an accident occurs, see a doctor immediately.
 Any fluid injected into the skin must be surgically removed within a few hours or gangrene may result.


Maintenance

- NEVER make adjustments, lubricate, clean, or perform any service on the machine while it is in operation.
- Make sure the attachment is serviced on a daily basis. Improper maintenance can cause serious injury or death in addition to damage to the attachment and/or your equipment.




USER'S MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

After the initial set-up assembly is completed (see page 16 of this manual), use the following procedure to mount the attachment to the loader for user operation.

⚠ WARNING Coupler wedges or pins must extend through the holes in the attachment mounting plate. Levers must be fully down and locked. Failure to secure wedges or pins can allow attachment to come off and cause injury or death.











- 3. Drive the loader to the rear of the attachment. Put the loader quick attach coupler into the attachment mounting bracket.
- 4. Tilt the loader coupler backward a small amount until it is fully engaged in the attachment mounting bracket.





6. Secure the coupler locking mechanism that attaches the attachment to the loader.

USER'S MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

7. Connect the hydraulic quick couplers from the attachment to the loader.

IMPORTANT: Wipe the ends of the hydraulic quick couplers (both lead and loader) with a rag to remove any possible contamination. Contamination can cause hydraulic components to fail and is not covered under warranty.

IMPORTANT: Make sure the quick couplers are fully engaged. If the quick couplers do not fully engage, check to see that the couplers are the same size and brand. Do not force the quick couplers together.

NOTE: See the loader's operator's manual for auxiliary hydraulic specifications and connection instructions.

NOTE: Attachment is shipped with 12FJX (1-1/16" Female JIC Swivel) fittings on the ends of the lead hoses.


8. Connect the wire harness to the loader's wire harness receptacle. (Disregard if a pistol grip controller is supplied with the attachment.)

Make sure the hoses are properly routed to fit your specific loader. If the hoses are not routed correctly, hoses may get pinched or rub on tires. Be sure to check the hose routing through the full range of intended motion of the attachment before operating it.

More than one routing may be acceptable depending on the loader. Pick the routing that best suits your loader.

IMPORTANT: Proper hose routing is the responsibility of the owner and/or operator. Pinched or stretched hoses are not covered under warranty.


Mounting is now complete and you are ready to use the attachment. Use the above instructions in a reverse order to dismount the attachment from the loader.






OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS







Getting Started

 Before using the attachment, survey the entire area carefully to make sure that there aren't any obstructions that may interfere with operation or damage the attachment.

IMPORTANT: Usually, clearing an area of rocks is the final operation, except for areas that have abundant rocks. When clearing rocks, it is necessary to set the attachment at a very shallow depth, just touching the soil. Large windrows could cause damage or premature wear to the rotor. Pick up the windrows before they become too large.

NOTE: If the soil is very hard and/or compacted, break up the ground before using the attachment.

- 2. With the operator in the seat of the loader, seat belt fastened, and seat bar lowered (if so equipped), start the engine.
- Using the loader's tilt function, tilt the mounting plate forward away from the loader. This is the position that will fully raise the drum of the attachment off of the ground for the transporting position.
- 4. Fully lower the loader's boom arms. With the throttle set at idle, engage the hydraulic drive, then gradually increase the throttle to operating speed.

Hydraulic Controls

All functions can be activated by the steering lever switches on the loader (if loader is equipped), or with the pistol grip control harness.

NOTE: Your loader must have the attachment control kit installed to make use of the lever switches.

The previously installed pistol grip allows the operator to engage all functions. (See "Set-Up Assembly" on page 16 of this manual.)

Functions are activated as follows:

Button 3 swings the attachment LEFT Button 4 swings the attachment RIGHT

NOTE: For steering lever functions, refer to your loader's operator's manual.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Adjusting Working Depth

The tilling depth should always be 1 to 2 inches in order to loosen the soil. Rock jamming could occur if the rotor depth is too great. Deeper tilling should only be done in an area that is rock free.

The attachment working depth can be changed by adjusting the loader tilt and lift, hitch pin, or the wheel supports.

Adjustment by loader tilt and lift:


To adjust the attachment working depth by using the loader's tilt function, tilt the mounting plate backward towards the loader to till deeper. Tilt the mounting plate away from the loader to till shallower. The attachment working depth can further be adjusted by moving the loader arms up or down.


Adjustment by hitch pin:


Working depth can be adjusted manually by removing the center hitch pin, pushing one side of the attachment either forward or backward, depending on the desired angle, and reinstalling the pin.

Adjustment by wheel supports:

- 1. Remove the hitch pin from the wheel support leg and set aside.
- 2. Adjust the wheel support leg to desired depth (refer to figure below for corresponding depth in inches).
- 3. Reinstall the pin and safety clip in the wheel support leg.










Top of Soil Conditioner

Adjusting the Rubber Shield

The rubber shield can be adjusted up to 2", to better suit the type of soil you are conditioning. To adjust the rubber shields, loosen all shield bolts, move the rubber shield to the desired location and retighten the bolts.

If the shield is higher when referenced to the drum, there is more material able to pass over the drum and discharge out the back of the attachment. The reverse effect is true when the shield is lower. (This is especially helpful when tilling in rocky conditions.)

Removing Obstructions from Rotor

If the rotor stops turning due to hydraulic relief, the overload could be caused by a rock or root caught in the attachment. In order to remove the obstruction, reverse the rotor. If this fails to remove the obstruction, throttle down the loader, disengage the hydraulics, shut off the loader, and remove the obstruction manually.

Leveling the Area

Leveling is done while tilling. Shallow settings give a smoother seedbed, while deeper settings level the ground better.

Experience will give the operator a better feel for the best settings to use in each situation.

Shutting Down

When shutting down the attachment, always throttle down the loader before shutting off the auxiliary hydraulics. Failure to do this may damage the attachment.


ROUTINE MAINTENANCE

⚠ WARNING Lower the attachment to rest flat on the ground, shut down the engine, relieve the hydraulic pressure to the attachment, wait for all motion to stop, and set park brake before leaving the operator's seat to perform service of any kind.


It is the operator's responsibility to make daily inspections of the loader and attachment for damage, loose bolts, fluid leaks, or anything else that could cause a potential service or safety problem. Preventive maintenance is the easiest and least expensive type of maintenance.

IMPORTANT: Bolts and set screws can loosen after initial usage. After the first hour of operation check all bolts and set screws. This must also be done daily before operation. If nuts or bolts are missing or damaged, replace immediately.





Use No. 2 lithium base gun grease when lubricating all attachment grease fittings.




Grease the (2) caster wheel bushings [A] after every 8 hours of operation.

Grease the (1) center pivot bushing **[B]** after every **8** hours of operation.







ROUTINE MAINTENANCE






Grease the (2) lower mounting plate pivot bushings **[C]** after every **8 hours** of operation.





Grease the lift pivot pin [D] after every 8 hours of operation.

NOTE: Pivot pin **[D]** found on floating mount models only.



Grease the rotor bearing **[E]** after every **80 hours** of operation.

IMPORTANT: Do not over-grease rotor bearing. Only add **two pumps** of grease every greasing interval.



Repack each caster wheel bearing **annually** using the following steps:

- 1. Remove each wheel from caster by removing cotter pin, slotted nut, and axle pin.
- 2. Clean all bearing components and repack using high quality grease.
- 3. Reassemble all bearing components and install new seals.
- 4. Reinstall each wheel in caster by reinserting the axle pin and reinstalling the slotted nut and cotter pin.

Caster Wheel Installation

The soil conditioner is shipped with the caster wheels arms pinned backwards on the unit.

After cutting the banding, it will be necessary to remove the pins on the attachment. The caster wheels and arms need to be flipped and bolted onto the attachment using the hardware provided.

A CAUTION Avoid heavy lifting that could cause injury. Use a hoist or two people and proper lifting techniques.

The caster wheels on the attachment are adjustable in 1" increments. Use the pin and appropriate holes for the desired adjustment height, as shown in the "Operating Instructions" on page 10 in this manual.

Wire Harness Installation

If the soil conditioner was ordered with the hydraulic angling package, a wire harness is required to activate the angling feature. If the loader is equipped with an attachment control package, an appropriate harness should be installed from the factory.

If the attachment was ordered with the pistol grip control harness, use the following steps to install the harness on the loader:

1. Install the control handle on either steering lever, whichever you prefer, with (2) hose clamps.

NOTE: The control handle bracket can be positioned several different ways. The recommended position is shown.

- Put a cable tie around the wiring harness and the steering lever.
- 3. Install the wire harness receptacle bracket on the loader arm or near the hydraulic quick couplers.

NOTE: It may be necessary to make an adapter bracket in order to attach the wire harness to the loader.











SET-UP ASSEMBLY







- 4. Route the wiring harness back along the tube lines on the loader arms and fasten with cable ties.
- 5. Open the rear door and pull the excess wiring into the engine compartment.
- 6. Raise the operator cab (see loader's operator's manual for the correct procedure).
- Connect the red fused wire to the positive battery terminal or to a suitable accessory wire with a minimum rating of 5 amps. Route the wiring along the loader main frame toward the front of the loader.
- 8. Fasten the control handle wiring harness connector to the main wiring harness connector.

IMPORTANT: Secure the wiring harness in place with plastic cable ties, making sure it is clear of extra hot areas or any moving parts on the engine or loader. <u>Pinched, stretched, or melted wire</u> harnesses are not covered under warranty.

9. Lower the cab (see loader's operator's manual for the correct procedure).


NOTE: Be sure the control handle wire harness is properly positioned as the cab is lowered.


